### What will you be learning?

- The 4 compulsory units are:
- Changing Awareness of Crime
- Criminological Theories
- Crime Scene to Courtroom
- Crime and Punishment

### Methods of assessment

2 externally assessed exam units and 2 internal controlled assessments.

### What are the lessons like?

You will be:

Looking at current crime awareness campaigns and planning your own campaign for change.

Investigating what crimes people are more/less likely to commit and apply criminological theory to criminality.

Evaluating criminal cases and investigations. Specifically focussing on roles of personnel and investigative techniques used.

Visiting the Crown Courts to see trial processes in action.

### How will we work with employers and the community?

We will work with a range of community justice practitioners including representatives from the Police Service, Victim Support, the Probation Service and the National Crime Agency as well as charitable organisations including Homeless Action.

## What can it lead to?

This qualification is suitable for learners who want to progress onto degree courses in a range of Social Science disciplines including Criminology, Sociology and Social Policy. It also provides a solid foundation for further learning in workplace environments including legal settings, public services and charitable organisations.
